### KARNATAKA HIGH COURT UPHOLDS STATE'S RIGHT TO FRAME ITS OWN EDUCATION POLICY

Bengaluru, August 13: The Karnataka High Court on Tuesday declined to interfere in the State government's decision to scrap the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and introduce its own education framework, stating that courts cannot intervene in policy matters unless they violate constitutional or statutory rights.

A Division Bench comprising Chief Justice Vibhu Bakhru and Justice Ramachandra D. Huddar delivered the judgment while dismissing a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by two Bengaluru-based advocates, Girish Bharadwaj and Ananda Murthy. The petition had challenged the State's move to withdraw from the NEP-2020, which had been implemented in Karnataka since the academic year 2021–22.

The petitioners argued that the decision to discontinue NEP-2020 would adversely impact students, faculty members, and the education system in the State. They emphasized that the NEP aims to create a uniform education structure across the country, and Karnataka's exit would disrupt this goal.

However, the Bench made it clear that the judiciary's role in policy-making is limited. "Courts cannot compel the State to adopt a particular policy," the Bench observed, adding that judicial intervention is warranted only when policy decisions infringe upon constitutional mandates or statutory provisions.

The verdict reaffirms the State government's autonomy in framing education policies tailored to local needs, even if they differ from national frameworks.



## RGUHS TO LAUNCH CAREER GUIDANCE CELL FOR HEALTHCARE STUDENTS

Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences (RGUHS) will soon launch a dedicated Career Guidance Cell to support students with career planning, skill development, and information on job opportunities after graduation. The initiative, approved at a recent Syndicate meeting, was officially announced on August 11, 2025, and is expected to become operational within the next three months.

The new cell will function through multiple verticals, each targeting a specific area of student support.

"Our primary objective is to ensure students are well-informed about the academic and professional avenues available to them both in India and abroad," said Prof. Bhagavan B.C., Vice-Chancellor of RGUHS. "From course options to industry connections, we want to guide them to make well-informed decisions post-graduation."

### Key Features of the Career Guidance Cell:

- **Academic Pathways:** The first vertical will provide comprehensive information on postgraduate and specialized courses available nationally and internationally, enabling students to chart their academic futures with clarity.
- **Industry Linkages:** The second vertical aims to connect students—particularly from courses like D Pharm, B Pharma, and allied health sciences—to relevant industry bodies. "We would like to guide them with the right information, but we will not place them. That is not our domain," the Vice-Chancellor clarified.

- **Finishing School:** The third vertical will focus on soft skills and career readiness. Students will receive personalized career advice and participate in workshops on resume building, interview techniques, group discussions, and debate preparation.

- **Language Lab:** A proposed language lab will offer training in foreign languages including English, Italian, German, French, and Japanese. "Many students spend large sums on external agencies for language learning. We want to provide this support within the university at a nominal cost," said Prof. Bhagavan.

The Career Guidance Cell will operate in a hybrid model, allowing students to access services both online and on campus. A dedicated committee will soon be formed to finalize operational details, and a university official will be appointed to lead the initiative.

RGUHS currently oversees more than 1,500 affiliated colleges and over 2.4 lakh students across disciplines such as medicine, dentistry, nursing, pharmacy, physiotherapy, and allied health sciences. The university believes this initiative will empower students to transition smoothly from education to employment.

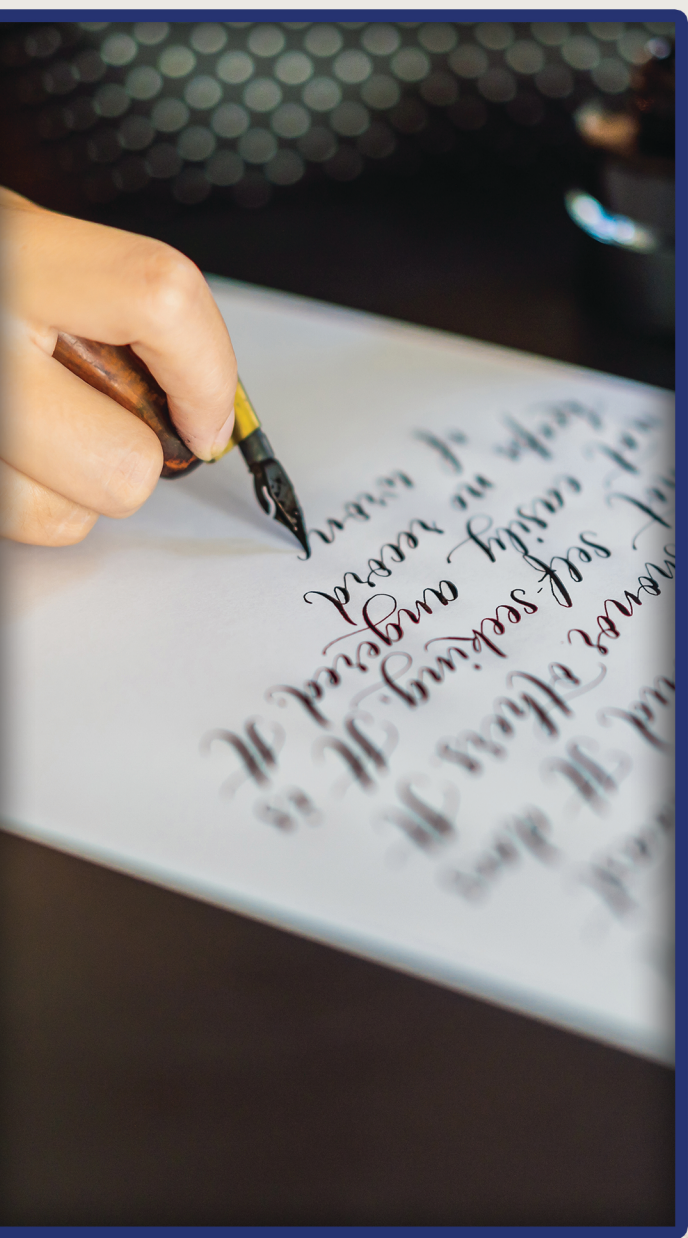
